

Defining Your Philosophy

III. The Daily Program For Children

A. The family child care home has a clear philosophy and goals concerning the care and education of children.

1. The provider gives parents a written statement of the philosophy for the family child care home.



The Basics

What is a program philosophy? A program philosophy is an educational framework that guides what you do in your program. It is a set of beliefs, goals, and values about child development that informs everything from daily routines to guidance practices. A written philosophy defines the program's objective and mission and articulates its influence on children's development. The set of teaching beliefs lead the "how" of children's learning. Although all child care professionals share a common goal of nurturing children's potential, how each program achieves that goal is unique to the program's philosophy.

Why is it important? A written philosophy provides transparency and clear expectations for families, helping decide whether a family will be a good fit for a program. Having clear direction for supporting children's development is also a predictor of high-quality practice. In one study, a provider's degree of intentionality was one predictor of quality in family child care. *Intentionality* includes (1) being intentional in planning experiences for the children and (2) having a child-related motivation for engaging in the work. A program's philosophy should also be referenced and compared to current practice, allowing for adjustments to either, as a form of ongoing quality improvement.

How do I write my program's philosophy? Begin by asking yourself three basic questions:

- 1. How do children learn?
- 2. What do children need to learn?
- 3. What should children learn?

Answers to these questions should inform answers to questions regarding selecting the daily routine, planning activities, determining guidance techniques, understanding the role of the educator, setting up the environment, choosing materials, and so forth. Although some programs adhere to a specific curriculum philosophy (e.g., Montessori, Waldorf, Reggio Emilia, AnjiPlay, etc.), many take an eclectic approach, combining elements of different philosophies to create one unique to the program. Obtaining Registry Credit* for Satellite's Virtual (Zoom) Professional Development Sessions

Spanish

To receive Registry credit at the conclusion of virtual (Zoom) professional development, follow these steps:

1. Each participant must register individually even if viewing the training with other participants on the same screen.

- 2. You must be present for the entire session. Late arrivals may not be admitted.
- 3. At the conclusion of the session, you complete an evaluation and then enter your information to receive Registry credit. This must be completed at the end of the session or your professional development hours will not be entered into the Registry by Satellite Family Child Care System. **

You can view and print your proof of attendance through your <u>Wisconsin Registry</u> account. It may take several weeks before your attendance is entered into the Registry. Certificates of completion will not be mailed or emailed to participants.

^{**}If you do not complete the steps above and wish to receive professional development credit for a Satellite event that you attended, you will need to complete the DCF form "Continuing Education Record—Independent Reading/Video Viewing " found here:

Extreme Cold and Winter Storms

For Your Home

- Stock a home emergency kit. Your home kit should include items such as food and water, cell phone and charger, flashlight and batteries, first aid kit, important medications, a weather radio, and a change of clothes. Visit Ready Wisconsin for more items and tips.
- Prevent frozen pipes. The <u>Red Cross</u> has tips for preventing and thawing frozen pipes.
- Make sure you have working carbon monoxide detectors. All homes and duplexes in Wisconsin are required to have properly working detectors on every level, including the basement, but not the attic or storage areas. Detectors can be purchased at most hardware stores or online for \$20-50.
- Never run a gasoline or propane heater or a grill (gas or charcoal) inside your home or garage. Any heating system that burns fuel produces carbon monoxide. Use a battery-powered detector where you have fuel burning devices but no electric outlets, such as in tents, cabins, and RVs.
- Run generators at a safe distance (at least 20 feet) from the home. Never run a generator in the home or garage, or right next to windows or doors.
- Remove snow safely. Wear sturdy, rubber-soled boots to help prevent slips and falls. To prevent injuries while shoveling, try pushing the snow with short strokes instead of lifting it. Also, use your leg muscles and not your lower back to move the shovel. Take frequent breaks to warm up inside and rest your muscles.




